

SENATOR AVERY: Just real quick and I understand Senator Maurstad's comments. This is I believe the last amendment. We can move on. The only thing is I don't believe that you'll know actually how much went to scholarships and how much actually went into the building areas and what maintenance. And I think it will also help the 309 Committee in terms of potentially what dollars were spent on the buildings and what they can supplement to it. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Avery amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Members, we are voting on the adoption of the Avery amendment to LB 1264. If you're in the Chamber, appreciate your attention to the voting board if you care to vote. Senator Avery, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR AVERY: Let's just have a roll call. We need to get the people here to...

SPEAKER WITHEM: You're requesting a roll call vote?

SENATOR AVERY: Right, and a roll call of the house...or call of the house, excuse me.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 3 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members please return. Let me clarify for the body what I have heard requested. I have heard Senator Avery requesting a roll call vote. Senator Maurstad. That's what I wondered if I'd actually heard that or not. Senator Maurstad has requested that that roll call be in reverse order. Senator Bernard-Stevens, could you check in? I hope Senator Schimek is home watching. Senator Pirsch, Senator Robak, Senator Brown, Senator Fisher, Senator Hudkins, Senator Witek, Senator Klein. Senator Avery has authorized us to proceed.
