SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor say aye. Opposed. They are adopted.

CLERK: Senator Wesely would move to amend. (See AM4021 on pages 1907-08 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: The good news is we adopted the Schimek amendment, the bad news is, it's going to cost a little bit of money. The Schimek amendment does require the hospice licensure. There is a fee to cover the cost, but evidently the fee, even though it's up to \$250, may not cover the cost. So this authorizes 13,660 in General Funds and 7,500 in Cash for 21,000 for the next fiscal year.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. Senator Wesely, closing. Closing's waived. The question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Members, your attention to the board, have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Wesely amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, anything further?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.
