SENATOR COORDSEN: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...profit might be generated from. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Mr. Clerk, an amendment to the amendment.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Withem would move to amend his amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Withem to open on your amendment to the Withem amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Mr. President and members of the body. What this amendment does, as I understood Senator Bromm's remarks about the amendment itself, Senator Bromm, what I heard you say was that no problem with directing Legislative Research and DAS to provide staff support, was a concern about the \$50,000. This amendment strikes the \$50,000 out of the amendment. We could have gone the other avenue I suppose, just simply divided the question, but this is the other way of doing it. I still think it would be a good idea to do this, but it is Senator Bromm's bill and if he doesn't feel comfortable incurring the additional expense of \$50,000 of taxpayers' money on the bill, then I would be accommodating and would offer this amendment to my amendment to strike the \$50,000 appropriation.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Withem. There are a number of lights on. We'll go through the list to see whether you want to speak on the amendment to the amendment. First, Senator Pirsch, on the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I rise to actually talk about the whole bill and amendments, but I'm glad that Senator Withem, Speaker Withem did strike the \$50,000. This is my priority bill. And as you can imagine, I don't believe that \$50,000 is needed to do this. I talked to you when this bill was on General File about
