SENATOR BROMM: That's not my intent.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Chambers. Excuse me, before we get to you, Senator Chambers, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the amendment. (See FA626 on page 1920 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Well, we get to you anyway, Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, what I'm looking at and I didn't have a chance to talk to Senator Bromm about this yet, but I think despite the fact that this agreement has been arrived at in terms of this amendment, it doesn't mean that nothing else can be done. So here's what my amendment will do and you should have a copy on your desk by now. On the first page in line 6, I would put a period after "state law" and strike the words "except as specified in Section 4 of this act." They're superfluous. All that Section 4 allows is the setting of a fee where none is specified in law. It does not allow under any circumstances a contract to be entered into where a fee is charged in excess of what is authorized by law. So I think leaving the language in Section 3 that I'm trying to strike would be misleading. If you leave that language in, it gives the impression that a fee greater than allowed by state law is somehow provided for in Section 4. But in fact, it is not. All that Section 4 allows is that when a contract is entered into for providing these services and no fee is specified by state law, then this report is given to the Exec Board. It does not say that a contract may be entered into for a fee in excess of that allowed by state law. So I'm striking some superfluous language. If you have any questions, I'll answer it...them. There shouldn't be any,
