

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Then that's all that I have.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hillman, your light is next followed by Senators Cudaback, Wickersham, Brashear, Beutler, Brown, Bromm, Kristensen, and Robinson.

And I think whether we keep them in our heart or if we ponder them with other people, I think we've done a lot of that on this particular bill. And Senator Chambers' amendment I think clarifies one issue that we had some discussion on and we had some questions; and though if we particularly like it or not, it does clarify it and I think we are aware of that. For me, the amendment does several things and I will go to the amendment now, not Senator Chambers' amendment. And in Section 3, number 1, the first sentence deals with new contracts, new contracts, I think if you keep that in mind. The second sentence then of Section 3 deals with existing contracts. Section 2 is the subscriber contracts which I don't think anybody has any problems with, and then Section 4 again deals with new contracts.
