And Senator Brashear said...talked about creativity, and also talked about that people wanted the information. Well, they did want it but there were some of them thought they were being charged too much. And Senator Bromm mentioned some of the libraries, and then we all know that evidently people that were getting it from motor vehicles didn't like it because they came forth with a lawsuit. Now Senator Cudaback made the statement about the...they just overlooked the Legislature. Folks, they didn't overlook at...they didn't overlook the Legislature. They just rammed right through us and forgot about us, and we all know that, and I don't know what the genesis of all that was but I'm still not...I'm still not completely satisfied with what happened, and there are a lot of other people in this Chamber that are not. Senator Bromm, or excuse me, Senator Brown expressed some of her concerns, and they are my concerns. I know they are concerns of everyone that sat on that hearing for the Government Committee. So I just wanted to echo what some of the things that Senator Chambers said, he was right on target, and what Senator Brown said, she was right on target. So I think the process we are doing, we are going to change things, but there is still a lot of...there are still a lot of unanswered questions on how this company came to be. Thank you very much.
