I do appreciate your also spending the entire session, I think you used the term "husbanding" although I think "wifing" ought to be in there also, the time here on the floor, everybody else's time.

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: And I think most notably you've done that by not being on the floor. Would that be a fair assessment? And I think by doing that, most people have appreciated your not taking that time on the floor other than the three minutes which you've used here in this point/counterpoint. Hopefully, the fact that you received three minutes and I received only two minutes is not an omen for future legislation. And with that, it is getting dry, it's very dry; so with that, I'm going to yield back the remainder of my time back to the Chair.

I'm sure there are some people here who have been very unwilling, I know I'm one of them, to have punched in my light the last hour to give Senator Bromm a chance to get the bill passed with some of these amendments. But I'd like to know from the Chair what the agenda may be with this specific bill with this specific amendment. Let's say if we do adopt the amendment or it's defeated and we go back to the bill one way or the other, could I have some opinion from the Chair as to where we might see this, if at all, on the agenda?
