SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Senator Kristensen, let me respond to that if I can. It's a fair question. I don't know how fair an answer I can give at this moment, how definitive an answer I can give because things are very fluid. For any bill to be passed by Thursday, sent to the Governor's desk, the Governor a chance to respond and then be back here for potential veto overrides, it has to go up to the bill drafter's office and be reported back before we adjourn today. Because of that, we have several bills still on Select File, including this one. We have a number of people who would like to have bills dealt with on Final Reading. I think my intention of 1375 would be to, if it does not advance this morning, would be to try to find some time later in the afternoon prior to going to Final Reading but after we've given some of these other bills a chance to get back to that bill again so we might special order it again approximately six o'clock would be...and that is a very loose answer. That is not definitive but that's what I'm thinking of at this moment. Senator Kristensen, does that answer your question? Senator Beutler to discuss the motion to suspend the rules. Senator Bromm, I understand you are seeking recognition.

SENATOR BROMM: Mr. Speaker, I would like to ask to pass over my motion at this time. I think Senator Chambers has had some discussion of his amendment and would like to proceed with that.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bromm. It will be...is it to be withdrawn and then refiled? Is that the procedure?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, my intent was to pass it over and leave it on file; but if I have to withdraw it and refile it, I will do so.

SPEAKER WITHEM: That is I think the cleaner way to do it if there's nothing else pending.

SENATOR BROMM: I would ask leave to do that, to withdraw and refile the motion.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers. Or excuse me, Mr. Clerk, the next item.
