SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, are you going to pull your amendment, Senator Chambers? Okay, then I have a question because I got some other agency problems, but I'll let Senator Chambers...I'll just yield him my time to do with his amendment what he would like to do with it.
