

completely blurred that distinction. The only difference now between somebody who comes out of state and wants to come in and basically a manufacturer wants to sell at retail, basically we're just saying because they come from out of state that we're going to allow them or because they don't have the retail location at the same place. And we run into the question of whether we have a rational basis for separating those two. By the way, I am quickly, rapidly finding out what it's like to be a lame duck, (laughter) and a lone duck, I guess. It's difficult to go and say, hey, we can take care of this next year. But the...when we talk about...when we talk about this, and I should make clear that obviously Dave Begley brought this concern to me and it's when I started looking into it, and I'm asking you to look into it, whether we want to do this to the three-tier structure. And we are eroding it. We are making a major change to it. Looks like an innocuous little change, but cut through the policy, cut through what the words... words look like, and look to what we're doing, and is that rational policy? I'm not sure it is. So at least we'd look to the question of renaming them. I am also going to pass around, so that I make clear when I would at least tell you when the wholesalers come back next year and start squawking about this that they've signed off on this, this year, so I won't be here to remind you, but hopefully someone will remind you that they've signed off on this. In other states, where the biggest areas, which are I believe Washington and Colorado, there's already movements to repeal the entire brewpub statute because of what it's doing to the system. And those are where the major areas are. In Colorado it's HB1168, and in Washington I believe it's SSB5175. And there is a concern. And I know the wholesalers this year put their...probably put their lobbyists in a difficult position where they were somewhat split on it on whether this is wise policy or not. And so it's a...it's something that I think we have to be prepared for as far as what it's going to do. The...when we get back to the suspension, or getting back to the suspension motion, obviously...
