

purchasers of beer kegs, proper identification and purchaser's signature are required," does this mean that their proper identification and purchaser's signature will no longer be required for buying kegs?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I don't know. I would defer to Senator Landis.

SENATOR WITEK: Senator Landis.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Witek, what we did three years ago was to put in, or a little bit longer, a form in which when you bought a keg you had a special registration that you signed and autographed, not just beyond showing the age that you were to buy a keg, but as a tracer. The theory was that we'd be able to trace kegs. In three years of doing this, for every keg sale in the state, we've had exactly two times in which there's been a potential considered violation of the law, and in neither case was there a conviction. What the Liquor Control Commission says is we've had three years of picking up paper, doing this registration, and there's been absolutely no recorded violation that has yielded a conviction in thousands of pieces of papers being added. What this said is it's a waste of everybody's time, our attention, our recordkeeping and the like, we would ask that the keg buyer show whatever proof they have to show, but that this current registration form is overregulation, it does no one any good, we have these recordkeepings, it's not providing us any level of law enforcement, and we'd like to be excused from the obligation of overregulating, that's why they brought the language.

SENATOR WITEK: Well, if I remember the debate during that time, and I was here, we discussed the problem with keg parties going on and underaged drinkers, at that time, at the keg parties and the need to, during these keg parties, establish at some point when...if law enforcement was called in, who purchased the keg, who purchased the liquor for the minors. And I thought it was a great idea to have to register with the purchaser so that you didn't just show ID and purchase a keg and this keg was out there and nobody knew who was responsible for the keg after that. I mean this is a large quantity of beer. And we had a keg party just a couple doors down from me at the time that I
