

would have loved to have known who purchased that keg and hold that individual responsible, and that was part of this requirement to have those individuals...if it's not working, or maybe people aren't being convicted of something here, that could be through the court systems and the attorneys. I don't know, I haven't had a chance to look into it because I just got this amendment a couple minutes ago. But I would think that the reasons that we initially accepted Senator Haberman's bill was because we wanted to have registration of these kegs, we wanted to have a person's signature and their identification and know who bought the kegs, that's what we wanted at the time. And I'm not willing to give up something like that here at the last minute on a bill that is talking about brewpubs, because I think that was a good policy that we should maintain. I've not heard any evidence that there's a problem with it, other than what you've just told me, that...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: ...they said there's a problem with it. But there's no reason why we shouldn't know who purchased these kegs and have them sign for these kegs, because that's the problem that I've seen on other occasions. There's a keg at a party, a bunch of people are drinking out of it, underage drinkers are drinking out of it, and then there is no one eventually to know who purchased that keg. And I thought it was supposed to be stamped on the keg, I didn't know it was just a sign that was up, I mean as I'm reading through here. But that's just memory that's changed that. But I'm not willing to give up the purchasers asking for proper identification and getting their signature before they can purchase the keg in a bill that's talking about brewpubs. So I won't be supporting this bill. Thank you.
