

25 votes. The question is whether, if you have those 25 votes, if it still sticks when it's looked at judicially. So with that, again I would urge that the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Landis. There are no further lights, Senator. It's not necessary. Senator Lindsay, to close.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President. Members, again I will just repeat what the amendment does. In your...in AM4434 there are two provisions. One provision says that manufacturers or wholesalers shall not in any manner, directly or indirectly, engage in basically getting into the retail business, whether that's through loaning of money, conducting operations, owning some interest in it, paying for a retail license, any of those types of things there is no...there is no, at this current point, no prohibition on brewpubs doing that. There's a second section which prohibits manufacturers or wholesalers from obtaining retail licenses. And right now it says that the section does not apply to craft breweries. So under current law a manufacturer can open a craft brewery, under current law they can do that. So the brewing company that we're talking about, or that has brought this issue to my attention, we won't even now allow, with this amendment they'll squeeze that out further, not even allowing that person to operate a craft brewery, or to operate a retail license. So what we have very clearly is a question of economic power, the votes are here to adopt the amendment and move it forward. Because of that a manufacturer who is going to locate a manufacturing plant in...in...near south Omaha, I guess, will not be allowed to open a retail location, whereas existing brewpubs are allowed to open a retail location. And the difference is simply because of what...how many votes are on the floor to do that. With that legislative history, for the purpose of providing intent on what LB 750 and AM4434 do, I would urge that the Lindsay amendment to AM4434 be adopted to change what that intent would be. With that, I would urge the adoption of the amendment. Madam President, I can't. I'm not sure I can count to ten on the floor right now, I would urge...I would ask for a call of the house and a machine vote.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. The question before you is call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
