

Senator Brown, will you check in, please. Senator Bromm. Waiting for Senator Beutler. The question before the body is a motion to suspend the rules in order to take up the Lindsay amendment to the Landis amendment. It is a motion to suspend the rules. It takes 30 votes. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Senator Lindsay requested a record vote. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1935 of the Legislative Journal.) Vote is 10 ayes, 22 nays on the motion to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion fails. I raise the call. We return to a discussion of the Landis amendment. Senator Lindsay, your light is next and I have that you've spoken three times. Senator Landis to close.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I call the question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? Senator, you don't need to call the question. You're closing on the amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, there are about four basic elements in the amendment. First, it raises from five to ten thousand gallons the amount that one of these brewpubs can do. Secondly, it merges two definitions of the brewpub and the microbrewery into something called the craft brewery. The third thing it does is it makes clear that to sell brewpub beer in some other location, and brewpub means to go through a distributor, thereby maintaining the three-tier system. It require...it also says that a craft brewer does not have to be a restaurant and it also lists the 50 percent limitation on the amount that can be sold off-sale based on the consumption inside the brewpub establishment. With that, I would ask for the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Landis. The question before the body is the adoption of the Landis amendment to LB 750. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
