

Landis' amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Landis amendment is adopted. Senator Schrock. Mr. Clerk, other amendments to the bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have is offered by Senator Lindsay. This is AM4346. It's found in the Journal on page 1816.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay, to open on his amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm sorry, Mr. Clerk, what page was that?

ASSISTANT CLERK: 1816.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I would withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Next amendment is offered by Senator Lindsay. It's AM4347. It's found in the Journal on page 1816.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay, to open on his amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members. It's another one I want to just get a record of what we consider important this year, again, same procedurally, although I'm finishing the suspension on it. The...we would need to move to...we would have to suspend the rules to permit consideration of this. The last one I withdrew is...was one that dealt with public funding of abortion and I should make clear I withdrew that. At this point in the session, I guess it would have been easy for me to introduce that. I could have bought enough time to finish out the session I think with that, but it's not an issue I, I guess, cared. I don't know if the word is to trivialize with making legislative points or not, but for that reason I withdrew that. This is AM4347 which does...it takes the Governor's income tax bill and it would gut the Landis...what is now the brewpub bill. It would gut the brewpub bill and allow for a reduction in income taxes. Now the question is, again, a bill which we never got to but a question is prioritywise we know that we consider brewpub legislation more important than library legislation.
