

do that, at least in the case of Columbus, is about that. In other cases it's smaller. However, this is a chance to visit the issue of brewpubs and hopefully leave it alone for a number of years and so that...there's a growth factor for that reason.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Okay. My question is this. I was aware of that brewer in Columbus that...was it...how...how large is the brewery that he's talking about building or he already has constructed this brewery that's up in that area of 10,000 barrels?

SENATOR LANDIS: He has, yes, he has constructed that and it is up in that area. There's another one, there's another brewer that's being talked about, but that's Senator Lindsay, David Begley, who'd like to build a large plant in Omaha or a...

SENATOR ABBOUD: So...

SENATOR LANDIS: ..significant plant.

SENATOR ABBOUD: ..but why, I don't understand, why should we have sympathy for a person that's building a brewery which is in violation of state law, that he couldn't sell the products.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR ABBOUD: He's selling a product that...or he's constructing a facility which is above the limit allowed under a brewpub. Is that...is that what you're telling me?

SENATOR LANDIS: There's been no violation of a law whatsoever.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Right, but is he building it over...he's building it over this 5,000 barrel mark.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Columbus plant?

SENATOR ABBOUD: Right.

SENATOR LANDIS: No, not that I know of.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Oh, okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: No.
