SENATOR WARNER: Ninety-six, ninety...'95-96, that can't be right, Corliss.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Well, then I was trying to say if we're delaying it...

SENATOR WAFNER: One year later than that.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: So '96-97?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. Got to be.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: (Laugh) Senator Warner...or Wehrbein says '97-98.

SENATOR WARNER: Anyway, it doesn't cost anything this year. How about that?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Wehrbein, let me ask you the question, if you would, sir.
