Select File for a specific amendment. Senators close to the Chamber or nearby, have you registered your votes? Have all senators voted that care to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The motion to return is agreed to. Senator Warner, to open on your amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as we discussed on the motion to bring it back, the amendment would prohibit the paying of the 20 cents a gallon incentive in the production of ethanol on any that was used or sold, rather, for the production of distilled spirits and, again, I was asked to offer the amendment. Without it, distilled spirits could be used if they had the proper production facilities. With the amendment, that would prohibit at least knowingly having any of this production shift for the purpose of making distilled spirits, and I'd ask the body adopt the amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: You've heard the opening. Are there...is there any discussion on the Warner amendment? Seeing none, Senator Warner to close. The question is...the closing is waived. The question is, shall the amendment be agreed to? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have all senators voted that care to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays Mr. President, on the adoption of the Select File amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The amendment is agreed to. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I'd move to advance LB 1121E to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: You've heard the motion. There being no lights for discussion, all those in favor say aye. Opposed say nay. The ayes have it. The bill is readvanced. Mr. Clerk.
