SENATOR LINDSAY: And I, I don't either. And I think there's, there's a comparable incidence that could occur right now where they send it back without adequate instructions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of...thank you, Senator Lindsay. Members of the Legislature, when you have an issue in any area which is technical, only the people who are trained in that area are going to take much interest in the discussion of that issue. But it takes more than those few to cast enough votes to affirmatively adopt that position. What you all are being asked to do this evening is to adopt this position that Senator Lindsay has presented to you and you have adopted it. The amendment has been adopted. All that remains now to do is to send the bill. And I'm going to tell you all something that I think you all believe based on what I saw you do here today. When Senator Brown puts her money in the bank, you know what she thinks they do? And, Senator Jensen, you're going to have to talk to her. She thinks that they put it in a little pink box with bow ribbons and write her name on it and put it in a drawer and just hold it there until she decides to come and get it. And Senator Kristensen thinks that when they take his Social Security money out of his check every time he gets a check, they put that in one of those big brown government envelopes which says, nobody had better mess with this and puts Senator Kristensen's name on it and they put that in a drawer under K for Kristensen, and that money stays in a drawer for him. That's what they believe. Senator Robak and I, though, know how these things operate. We might put our check in a drawer, but when we put the money in the bank, they don't put it in a little box for us nor does Social Security put our money in an envelope with our name on it. Here's the point I'm trying to get to. You all are relying on your emotions and you want to slap the court, and you certainly can do that. If this were the days of duels, you could walk up to somebody who you know is a better swordsman than you, a better pistol shot than you, but because you're so carried away with your emotions, you'll smack that person and challenge them to a duel. But as soon as you smack them you realize what you've done. You've sealed your fate, judgment day, curtains, it's over. Well, it's not going to be as serious a thing as that in this instance. The worst that can happen is that the Legislature will look ridiculous. And that is something which is not unfamiliar to the Legislature. I
