

security and you couldn't do those things. This section just protects those nonprofits and makes sure it's clear that members can't pass membership rights to other persons. Some of those may not have charitable interests or interest intentions at all, but this is just to ensure that nonprofits continue as nonprofits and that they don't sell memberships. And that's the only reason that's in there. I think those were the items that Senator Lindsay and I were going to discuss, rather I did it in a narrative form. Madam President, at this point in time, if there are any lights I'd be happy to answer any questions about those two sections. If there are not, I would request to withdraw the motion to return.
