SENATOR CHAMBERS: You just read to us a long paper that said since he gave this opinion why should he want to go to court to argue against his own opinion. You read it but you didn't pay attention to it. She doesn't even pay attention to the opinions of her great friend when she reads them. Unfortunately, I pay attention to Senator Witek when she reads. And what she read for us is a strong statement from the Attorney General that he has ruled. He didn't say he gave just an opinion, he has ruled. Courts ruled, not attorneys general. She read where he said he has ruled and having ruled, why should he want to take it to court? And if it goes to court, he will take a position of defending his opinion.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.
