

SENATOR WITEK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Witek, you're going to vote no on the resolution, correct?

SENATOR WITEK: Yes. Yes, I am voting no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: May I ask you why you are voting no?

SENATOR WITEK: Because I believe that we have already reached a resolution for this problem.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: ...does more good than harm. And if we go ahead, I believe we will be doing more harm than good so I'm staying at this point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If we don't adopt the resolution today, it could be brought up again next year, couldn't it? The same resolution could be brought up next session.

SENATOR WITEK: Well, (inaudible) Senator...well, it could be, sure, it could be brought up next year.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And we'd go through the same questions about uncertainty and so forth that we're dealing with today, couldn't we?

SENATOR WITEK: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if we pass the resolution and it goes to court, the same questions won't be before us after that as are before us now, would you agree?
