SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1177 passes. I would like to pause one second and introduce a guest to the Legislature. Sitting under the south balcony, we have Senator JoAnn Morford-Burg. She is from Wessington Springs, South Dakota, the minority whip of the State Senate in South Dakota. Senator, it's very nice to see you here. ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 465 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 465 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 2033-34 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 1 present not voting. 1 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 465 passes. LB 465A.

CLERK: Senator Kristensen would move to return the bill for purposes of striking the enacting clause, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is not a false alarm. This is not designed to speak on it. We actually do need to defeat this bill. It's an unnecessary A bill that has gotten to Final Reading, and we just can't pass it over. We have to strike the enacting clause and kill the bill at this point in time, and I would urge the body to defeat the bill. Thank you. And it needs to be returned...or no, it can just be struck, isn't that...is that correct, Mr. Clerk?

SPEAKER WITHEM: It needs to be returned, I believe.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: It needs to be returned then stuck? I'd ask the body...excuse me, vote to return it so we can strike the enacting clause at that point in time.
