SPEAKER WITHEM: They are withdrawn. Anything further?

CLERK: Senator Landis would move to return.

SENATOR LANDIS: I will withdraw this. I only want to say that I think John has made some fair points. There is nothing in this bill that takes away any rights for a microbrewer or somebody who wants to manufacture liquor. All it does is to give brewpubs some rights that they do not now have. It takes away nothing from anyone else, and that's the point that I wanted to make. I'll withdraw the motion and we can proceed with the reading.
