LB 901, 952, 1039

CLERK: 40 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Motion is reconsidered. We're now back in time, taking a vote once again on the motion to adopt LB 901 with the emergency clause included. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted, all of you wishing to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2038-39 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 15 nays on the passage.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill passes with the emergency clause attached. Senator Coordsen, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Point of personal privilege, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: State your point.

SENATOR COORDSEN: My point, Mr. Speaker, is to thank those who voted against their heartfelt convictions in order to help some little people who got caught. And I do appreciate that, and you've done some good work, and thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Mr. Clerk, LB 952.

CLERK: (Read LB 952 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 952 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2039-40 of the Legislative Journal.) 48 ayes, 0 nays, 1 present and not voting, Madam President.
