PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1055A pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2043-44 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 1 nay, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1055A passes. Senator Hillman announces that the following guests are visiting the Legislature, there are ten eighth graders here from Cedar Canyon School in Gering. (Introduced teachers.) Will you all stand and be recognized, please. Welcome to the Legislature. LB 1076.

CLERK: Wesely would move to return the bill for specific amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely to open on his motion.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President and members of the Legislature. You probably recall that last time we visited this issue was yesterday afternoon when this amendment was offered by Senator Kristensen and myself to deal with the problem caused by Senator Will's amendment to the bill. Our amendment was an attempt to not repeal the Will amendment but to delay its implementation for a year so that we could study its impact and determine whether or not there would be a cost associated with the amendment. The amendment would have provided that a firefighter that came down with cancer would qualify for prima facie evidence in any question about disability or death benefits. The cities were concerned about that and wanted time to look at it further. Because we unceremoniously adjourned
