Madam President, an Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Klein to be inserted in the Journal (re. LB 1121). And I have a lobby report to be inserted per statute, and two reports, one from the Department of Roads, the second from the Department of Administrative Services. PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We now turn to Final Reading. Will senators please return to your seats. We are on Final Reading. We are on Final Reading, will senators please return to your seats. LB 693.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 693 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 693 pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2094 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 41 ayes, 3 nays, 2 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 693 passes. We now turn to motions to override gubernatorial vetoes on LB 1189. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LB 693.

CLERK: Madam President, with respect to 1189, certain line-item reductions, as indicated by the Governor in his message received by the members, the first motion I have this morning is from Senator Wehrbein, as Chair of the Appropriations Committee. Senator, this involves override with respect to a Federal Fund earmarked for state aid contained in line 19, Section 93 of the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein to open on the override motion.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Madam Speaker and members. First of all, the committee recommended last night to override no bills, no money, so that the body is clear. Our report
