I acknowledge that it does give him more flexibility. PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators, will you check in. Senator Bohlke, will you check in. Senator Lynch, Senator Pedersen, Senator Chambers, Senator Coordsen, Senator Cudaback, Senator Hillman. Senator Coordsen, Senator Cudaback. We are waiting for Senator Coordsen. Senator Wehrbein, go ahead? Senator Wehrbein requested a roll call vote. The question before you is the motion to override the veto. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2095 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 7 nays on the motion that the earmark become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor, the earmark with respect to state aid found in Section 93.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion to override succeeds. Next motion.
