We were all about ready to throw up (laughter). In fact, it reminds me of a story because we had a bomb alert that day, for those of you who were then in the body at that time we had a bomb alert. And we had a Speaker at the time who had a sense of humor, Senator Baack, unlike the Speaker that we have now (laughter). But nonetheless, Senator Baack had a meeting with the Governor that afternoon. And they had cleared the building, the bomb thing went off and the dogs came in and what have you. And he went into Governor Orr's office and he said, hey, did you hear the good news? They found the bomb. And she said, no, no, where was it? And he said, well it was a copy of your speech in the wastepaper basket over there (laughter). And I don't think she took that real well, consequently. But nonetheless, there are so many funny things that happen to all of us here. But she was right in one area of the speech. If you're here late at night, and I say this in all seriousness. If you're here late at night, the wind's blowing a little bit and the doors are open, the lights are down. It's not dark, I'm not in here in the dark by myself (laughter). The lights are on. But if you are here and you sit back and you just listen, I'll swear, if you listen hard, you'll hear voices of senators who were here before. And it's kind of nice to know that, that when somebody else comes in late, and they'll listen, maybe my voice will be there. And if it is, I know what it'll be saying. I move to bracket.
