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Guards Race to Protect Florida Captive; the subhead: Machine Guns Quiet Down Mob After Lynching of Black Slayer. Another headline: Hauptmann Has One Alibi, Says A Writing Expert. Another: King of Siam is to Abdicate His Ancient Throne. Another: Croatia May Tie Herself to the Italy Standard; then the subhead: Possible Break From Yugoslavia to Unite With Former Enemy. Then, before I go into what I want to: Mercury Dips Below Freezing in Lincoln. This paper relates a debate between a Professor J.P. Senning, S-e-n-n-i-n-g, and a fellow named C. Petrus Peterson, after whom a room is named down here for something or other. Now, they were talking about the purpose of a Legislature because on the ballot was a proposal to convert the Legislature here from a two-house to a one-house operation. Senator Brashear I thought was going to talk about not cutting away the jurisdiction of the Judiciary Committee, but he chose not to make that statement. My view is that, despite the workload of the committee, we should not cut away its jurisdiction, we should not give it more days. Because the function of a Legislature is the following, and this is from C.P. Peterson: The one-house plan is a lawgiver, not a means, as we have now, of bringing the expressions of needs, objectives and theories into law. The most important function of the Legislature in Nebraska is to explain to the people that their wishes and their bills would not make good laws. Killing bills is more important than giving laws. In serving with Senator Brashear, what I've got to say here is that before this door of opportunity slams, perhaps never to be open to me again, there are a few comments that I do want to make. I have watched Senator Brashear mature in the ways of the Legislature. I've watched him grow into the Chairmanship of the Judiciary Committee and I've seen him wax comfortable in managing the committee's affairs, so I am wholeheartedly in favor of Senator Brashear remaining the "Chaircreature" of the Judiciary Committee. And if anybody stands on this floor to place his or her name in nomination in opposition to Senator Brashear, that person may not have operable kneecaps. Thank you. (Laughter)
