that alone because most people, as the Speaker pointed out, will not offer that many. Sometimes, with all due respect to Senator Crosby, for whom I am very fond, if that doesn't ruin her reputation. If it does, then I'll say I was lying when I said it. We don't serve our constituents, in my opinion, by giving them the impression that we're at their beck and call and whim whenever something pops into their head. Our primary responsibility is to enact wise, just, and sound laws. The next most important thing, although I think it's the first thing in the process, is to kill bad bills, and to restrain ourselves so that we won't offer meaningless, pointless resolutions. Senator Crosby is correct in saying that during that time, when these items are being considered, rarely does anybody pay much attention. There is walking around and other things being done, and that is not necessarily the best use of our time, and perhaps senators should find a different set of circumstances under which to do this kind of work. But I hope that what Senator Crosby said will not prevent the passage of this rule change. For those who are new, you'll have plenty of time to be hounded by your constituents, and the more you yield to them the more inane, cockamamie, I am being nice now, lunkheaded bills will be brought to you. Some are going to be brought to you by the Attorney General because you're new and you don't understand anything, and you're impressed by the fact that somebody called the Attorney General has asked you to offer a bill. Usually it's one of those clunkers that hasn't gone anywhere and you don't know that, so you take and run with it, then after you get singed real well, you say I'll never do that again. Some people will learn only from experience. You can tell them in the nicest voice, in the most logical way, that if you want to leave this room, the best means is by way of the door. Don't bash your head against the windows because you won't be able to break them. Don't try to break your way out the wall because stone is stronger than bone, but some want to try it. So they lower their head and run against the wall as hard as they can, and when they wake up, they say, well, I guess what you told me was true and I got a little lump and a headache, but I'll never forget that lesson. Sometimes it would be good if we could learn through the operation of intellectual processes instead of very bad experiences that take a toll on us. These resolutions are those bad experiences. The worst kind, in my opinion, are the ones that will be dealt with by the next offering of Senator
