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that is, that's one of those big horses that can pull this building down by itself, and put it on the back of a Chihuahua. The Chihuahua cannot carry the saddle. That rule is what you would call overkill. The Speaker told you that he offered senators, whose bills were under siege, the opportunity to take advantage of this rule and they didn't want to. See, I will deliver on what I say I will do, and they know that once it's invoked, they are going to have to invoke it on every bill that comes before us, every bill. And I'm going to put my name up there as one of those who wants to be a part of the discussions of how we're going to schedule, which amendments will come up, and so forth, and I will let them know all these amendments that I intend to offer. But in bumping some of mine, they cannot say that we're going to let some other senator offer what you were going to offer while keeping yours out because I will charge you with discrimination. I'm not allowed to offer it, as the only black member, but this white member can offer the same amendment and get it jumped ahead of mine. I can anticipate the amendments that will be offered on a bill by those who support it. I can anticipate amendments that they ought to offer but they don't know enough to offer, and I will discuss these things with senators. I have worked with Senator Bromm to clean up a bill he had. I worked with Senator Bruning on a bill that I detested. I have worked with practically every senator on this floor, yet I've become the target and I am the villain. And when you reach the last stop before plunging into oblivion, do you know the one you turn to? Not Ghostbusters. They come to me and say, Ernie, is there some way something can be done about this? And being the wise person that I am, thinking about the institution, I work with these senators, knowing how they have had their fingerprints on the dagger that's protruding from my back. I know this body, Senator Redfield, Senator Smith, Senator Bourne, sitting there trying to be quiet and blend in with the background and think I'll not see him. But how can he hide behind a purple book? There's a contrast there, it won't work. I see all and know all. I'm like Argus. Look up Argus in the dictionary, maybe Senator Tyson, who's not doing anything constructive, can tell you all about Argus, and what Argus's main attribute was. But here is what we're confronting--a rule that does nothing except clutter the book. Even some of those other provisions, such as cloture, have not been regularly utilized, and instead of the cloture rule, limiting debate in
