CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dierks would move to suspend Rule 3, Section 13, to permit scheduling of a bill for public hearing by the Agriculture Committee next Tuesday.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Dierks, you're recognized to open on your motion.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, thank you very much, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. This is a procedural rule that we're able to go through to allow us to have a hearing within the week normally required after it's been published in the Journal. It will be published in the Journal I think maybe tomorrow, and we want to have that hearing on Tuesday. The two bills we're going to hear, one is concerning changing the time frame on grain warehouse inspections from 9 months to 12 months, a technical thing, won't cause much problem. People don't have to come from around the state to get here. The other one is on lab testing procedures for agricultural labs. It's a bill that was heard last year. It got on consent calendar but we didn't...or it became a committee priority bill but we didn't get to talk about it. Those two bills are what we want to hear and we need to have your approval to do that. So I thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the motion? Senator Dierks, you're recognized to close on your motion to suspend the rules. Closing is waived. The question before the body is the suspension of rules to allow public hearing and suspend the seven-day rule, public notice of public hearing. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the seven-day notice requirement.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The rules are suspended and the notices are accepted. Any announcements or messages from the desk, Mr. Clerk? New bills, Mr. Clerk.
