night, because her compensation was based on the number of paying customers. I pointed out that not one, single male coach was put in that situation, and I thought it was atrocious, and it made my usual suggested changes that ought to occur. And her situation was upgraded, to some extent, not that it...to the level it should have been. There were two female gymnasts who were to have their scholarships lifted because they were injured. I am the one, Senator Redfield, who fought hard to get through this Legislature a bill that said athletes cannot have their scholarships lifted for injury. The university opposed it and said they would never do that. But as soon as these two women were injured, the dumb coach, but he made my job easy for me, of the gymnastics team said, they are injured; they can't help the team; we're taking their scholarship. Nobody spoke for them, nobody, except me. And I got that situation resolved, not the President of the university, not a member of this Legislature, not even the family of those girls, because they felt nothing could be done. But that's not my attitude, so I am not unmindful of what happens to the athletes, because another bill that I got through the Legislature says that, if any athlete, not just at UNL, any athlete suffers an injury, that person must be given assistance, at least the equivalent of workers' compensation. And in the event of a catastrophic injury they will have coverage, and Nebraska is the only state in the Union with that kind of legislation, and that's because Nebraska is the only state in the Union with an Ernie Chambers in their Legislature, who will not just talk about Nebraska, number one. Yeah, they're number one in football, and number nothing in everything else. But I don't see these athletes as things or X's and O's on a chalk board. I see them as young people who are put under an unconscionable amount of stress and pressure. And when they do the best that they can, but do not win, they're treated as though they lost on purpose. But as long as they're winning they are heroes and heroines, it should not be that way. So that is what...
