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is a concern in the body that once you create a commission it only gets bigger. You keep adding to it. It comes before the Appropriations Committee, as Senator Crosby says. One year it's 75,000 and the next year it comes in, needs 150,000 in order...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Understand that.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...to sustain this, and it continues to grow. And so what I would like to ask is, what would you be able to do if we created this commission that you can't presently do, beside get \$75,000?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I think I just...I just really said that...I just explained to you why we should do it and...and part of that explanation is that we would have more oversight over it...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...and that it would have some degree of stability and that it...and this does set up a fund and allows it to take in gifts and grants and that kinds of thing. Now, they are doing that already...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: That's...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...to some degree.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...that's what I'm asking.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But I think this puts...puts more teeth into their fund-raising abilities, too, when you have it established like this.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yeah, many of those things you've mentioned are things that you're currently doing, the receipt of funds and so forth.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The receipt of funds, yes.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Okay. I yield back the balance of my time.
