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you look at the agencies that it helps, it's difficult to be against that. But the other thing, when you speak about volunteerism, in particular, I want this again to be on...for us to think about, over the years most of the volunteers in so many of the organizations that I belong to and you belong to, most of those volunteers were women. Women are working now, more women than ever. They do not have time for the daytime activities that most of these organizations require. And so there are certain age groups that are doing a lot of the volunteer work. And the men have come along now, I think, and perhaps are volunteering more than they used to because of the fact that women are not available always to do those things that we took for granted as we grew up, and since the sixties that has all changed, particularly since the seventies, in the last twenty years. Every organization that I belong to, they might have a good membership who are paying dues, but they don't volunteer to do the work to keep the organization going. So, for that reason, I'm going to vote for the bill, Senator Schimek. I do think by the time, if it goes this morning, which I hope it does, perhaps you could have some answers by Select File, so we feel comfortable with doing this, this morning. And I do want to say once more, someone asked the question, will they come back and want federal funds replaced? Of course they will. Every single time we have gone through this, we went through this two years in Appropria...two years ago, when we started the budget, there were a lot of federal funds that were being pulled. Every one of those agencies asked the state to replace those federal funds. The DARE Program is a perfect example, right, Senator Wehrbein? A very good example is that DARE Program. So all this sounds great...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...and I'm going to vote for it. But by Select File maybe, Senator Schimek, you'll have some answers that will help us. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The Chair recognizes Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Senator (sic) Maurstad. Am I the only light on, or...
