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SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Senator Cudaback, would you answer a question, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, I would.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Regards the fiscal note.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There is one but it's rather...I'm reluctant to say the words "small amount" because that's a bad...everybody says, oh, it's a small amount. It could be...it could be anywhere from 50,000 to...and then somebody said that there wouldn't be any because they wouldn't need to add a person. Now you've heard that before, too, but...

SENATOR REDFIELD: That was my question. It says there that they would add one full-time employee, and my question is, if they're going to run fewer checks, would they not be eliminating someone, but it is not reflected in the revenue statement there?

SENATOR CUDABACK: No, they said that perhaps they wouldn't have to add anybody. Of course, we've heard this before, too, so I'm not going to say it won't cost more, it won't cost less. All I know is efficiency, so it makes sense to say that they probably shouldn't have to add anyone to...

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...to address this.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The Chair recognizes Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. Senator Cudaback, would you answer a question for me, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Cudaback, would you yield?
