SENATOR CHAMBERS: That happens sometimes. But, see, I watch the way some of the senators take umbrage on this floor, and when certain things appear in the newspaper that are not even libelous, umbrage is taken because they're true, and that truth the person may not want to be told. I got to speak one more time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The Chair recognizes Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President and members, I appreciate all this talk, and we need talk like this here to make sure a bill is in shape, but if Senator Matzke or anyone has any problems or questions, absolutely, we will work with them. I wanted this bill as perfect as possible. We'll change it, whatever, and if it doesn't work, we won't pass it. And I appreciate Senator Chambers' comments. Right now any person who goes into a store, I won't use names, goes into a store, there probably aren't any restrictions. He can charge what he wants to. Do you hear me? He can go in and charge what he wishes to. Now we want to make this card so there aren't any, I guess we could say, there aren't any limitations, just like right now. Right now most people can go into a store and charge what they want to. Now if we want to have this card the same open, well, we could, but I just thought it would be better if we had like, you say, you can go into a hardware store, you can probably buy hardware stuff, or whatever, you know I don't know. But you probably couldn't take this card into a dress shop and buy a dress with it. I don't know, maybe it shouldn't have any restrictions. There aren't now. If you're authorized to charge for the state of Nebraska, you're authorized to charge. You and I both, all of us go in and charge our motels, don't we? I do. I go in and charge my motel, and they take my word, I guess. Is that good or bad? I guess they take my word that I'm Jim Cudaback and I've got the ability to charge, and some things you just have to trust. I mean, that's just the way our system works. Company after company after company after company gives employees a credit card. This isn't a system we're creating here in the state of Nebraska. Think of the companies, Mobil. Here I stay companies, I am not...I wasn't supposed to advertise here, but companies give credit cards to people, third party people,
