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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...we're just compiling. That is the vision. But perhaps at some point in the process we would ask for more detailed information in some area or another. But you raise an interesting point and one that I do not have an answer for you at this particular time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, Senator...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And I yield my time back to Senator Beutler, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek, essentially there was no time left. Your light is on next and you're recognized.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Then I would yield some of my time to Senator Beutler to continue the conversation.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Just to ask you, Senator, to respond to the second question, was...which was how you would feel about extending that power in Section 4 to all committees of the Legislature.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Really, I really don't have an off-the-top-of-my-head response. If you're talking about a blanket kind of thing, I think that we should be careful. I'd have to think about that for awhile, Senator Beutler. Did you care for any more time?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. Mr. Speaker, members of the body, there's a couple of points that I would like to address and I appreciate the points that Senator Landis raised. I want to assure you that this is not a power grab and it isn't a...it's my intention simply to set up a process in place. And if this body feels that it should more readily or more appropriately go to the Executive Board, I don't have a big problem with that. I do think that some precedent has been set for the Government
