SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...that, as the bill moves ahead, because I think it's important that we determine how this money is being used and where it's going and if we're going to add funds, monies, to it, I would like to know, at least have some clue as to what's going to be...what it's going to be used for, and I think you probably would too. So I'm not...I'm not standing up to oppose your bill. I just thought maybe you might have some idea and if we could...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't know about that.

SENATOR VRTISKA:if it does come about, we will discuss it and see what the future might be, and I just thought you might be made aware of that and, like I said, I will do some research and talk to you. But we've got time to do that at a later date.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR VRTISKA: With that, I have no more. I just wanted to bring that issue up. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate? Senator Schimek, you're recognized to close on the advancement of LB 59.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I've decided, after talking with my own legislative aide and legal counsel to the Revenue Committee, that we will come back on Select File with a clear definition of what we're talking about when we mean "location" and who this actually impacts, because there seems to be different theories flying around, and I want to make sure that we nail it down and have it accurate. So we will provide that for you on Select File, a description of what "location" really means here. Thank you.
