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again and the cap would be \$425 as a maximum fee per day for an appraiser and...

SENATOR ROBAK: As opposed to \$250 a day.

SENATOR BROMM: Correct. That's correct.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay. Now, does the Department of Roads pay that appraiser, or does the county?

SENATOR BROMM: It could be either one, Senator Robak. This applies to all condemnation proceedings so it could be the Department of Roads.

SENATOR ROBAK: Well, I am signed on...

SENATOR BROMM: It could be the county.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: It could be a city. Could be an NRD.

SENATOR ROBAK: Oh, I see. Okay. I guess I was thinking it's the Department of Roads. If it's by eminent domain, it would be the Department of Roads. Is that correct?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, that...it could be, but also the cities and the counties and the NRDs have the power of eminent domain as well...

SENATOR ROBAK: I see.

SENATOR BROMM: ...and this applies to all eminent domain proceedings.

SENATOR ROBAK: Since I do live in the same judicial district that you do, this was brought to my attention too, and I'm a cosigner of your bill. I like your amendment and I do like your bill to begin with, so I stand in support of your amendment and that clarified my question. Thank you.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Robak.
