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50 cents, as provided under the constitutional provisions, but the maximum duration of that would be 5 years; that's the same vote that they could take under 1114. And we make sure that that extra vote is excluded from the limitations of 1114. It wouldn't make any sense to say that you have a voted tax increase and it's still subject to the limitations of 1114. There are provisions in a couple of instances where we change wording, to make sure that actions are taken by the county board of equalization rather than the county board. One of those, for example, is an exemption applied for by a veteran of the Armed Forces, they can qualify, in some instances, for an exemption from the motor vehicle tax. Instead of referring that to the county board that is properly referred to the county board of equalization. That change is made. There is a provision that will have some resonance with a portion of the committee amendment that I would discuss later. That states that if the majority of voters at a town hall meeting reject a levy override, then the political subdivision cannot subsequently call for a public election. Remember the town hall meetings are special provisions for the small or miscellaneous political sub...some of the miscellaneous political subdivisions, the smaller ones. Instead of having to go through a full-blown election process, they can have a town hall meeting to exceed the levy limitations of 1114. The changes that are made in the provisions for allocation of the Fire Aid Fund that we created relate to whether you can count...how you count municipalities in the population. The provision changes it so that you can create...so that you can count second class cities in that...in the population count that would be necessary to determine the amount of aid that goes to the mutual finance organization. I'm looking...missing the reference to that section, if you'll...section. Okay, that is in Section 8, if you wish to examine, in more particular detail, the provisions of that proposed change. This bill does carry the emergency clause. I would bring that to your attention because some of these provisions we want to implement, in particular any changes in the fire aid bill need to be made prior to July 1st, because that's the qualifying date for those applications. I hope that I've covered all of the subject matters that are in the bill. It does, as I've indicated, range across a variety of subjects. It is, although it's largely a cleanup, there are several substantive provisions. I think I'll close on the main bill,
