SENATOR CROSBY: ...so we can hear the speaker.

SENATOR ENGEL: ...between those two cities, but, like I say, that's an arbitrary figure we picked. We didn't want to put it 500 miles because you kind of destroy the effects of IFTA. This is just for...to get rid of a nuisance and it does impede commerce on a border area.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I certainly support the idea that we do what we can to bolster commerce, particularly when it doesn't seemingly contribute significantly to the funds we have available for maintaining roads. I would be interested in looking a little more carefully at whether or not there would be another way to specify a distance that might be appropriate should other states get involved.

SENATOR ENGEL: Well, I'd be willing to offer...accept any suggestion between now and Select File, if someone would want to do some research on that. We will do our part. And anyone who's interested, if they do their part and bring it to us, we'll certainly consider it.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Engel.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Any further discussion on LB 77? Seeing none, Senator Engel, you may close.

SENATOR ENGEL: I waive closing, thank you.
