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receive a check. He will not receive any dollars. So I really can't see what we're really arguing about here. It's an investment. We're upgrading our National Guard. If they want to further their education, want to better themselves, why not let them? I can't really see...I wish somebody would explain to me why we're not just exchanging from one pocket to another pocket. But in my opinion, that's what's happening. We will not see, really, a reduction in our General Fund dollars because the money goes from this over to here. Stays right here in Nebraska, stays right...and betters us, so I wish somebody could point out to me where we're actually spending dollars. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. Madam President, members of the body, I'm not sure how to respond to Senator Peterson's question except to say that I think I want this tuition to go to a regionally accredited college or university and it doesn't matter if they're independent, not-for-profit, state college, university, but they should be accredited. And I'm...Senator Peterson, could I ask you to just respond to a quick question?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Which colleges, again, were you talking about or which institutions?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Peterson.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Senator Schimek, the three colleges are accredited by national organizations recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. They are not, at this time, recognized by regionally accredited associations, because that's typically not their mission, to do that. It's a very costly procedure. It's a very costly procedure and it's just not what they need to do for the types of courses they teach. Now they are the only three in the state, it's my understanding, that are that way, and I'd be glad to get to you with the accreditation requirements that they have, the difference between the regional and the national. When we were going through this with LB 1030, the Coordinating Commission said the students of three...these
