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SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, Senator Janssen, where is there any age specification in here that limits it to young people?

SENATOR JANSSEN: There is none.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, what would prevent...what is the highest rank a person can have in the National Guard and take advantage of this program? Is there any limit on the rank?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, no, there isn't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So any person in the National Guard, the General could take advantage.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I suppose he could if he could pass the entrance exam...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Colonels, majors, captains, lieutenants, sergeants,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...because it does not specify who it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...corporals, privates.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Does not specify.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Members of the Legislature, these kind of bills receive very little focused thought and attention. We have conjured up for us images of tornado cleanup, blizzards that occurred decades ago, and other things that are designed to muddy the water and fuzzy our thinking so that we say this is a good thing and give it. The National Guard probably is under greater control of the federal government than the state. I'd like to ask Senator Janssen another question. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.
