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written right now, any member of the Nebraska National Guard who enrolls, it has to be in a regionally accredited college or university in this state. I have handed out a letter from the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, which dealt with this issue last year, and showing that, again, the idea of inclusiveness is one that we should be working towards as opposed to exclusiveness. But let me talk a little bit more about the issue of regionally versus nationally accrediting. This is a letter from the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools, and basically it says that the purpose of accreditation is to assess and enhance the educational quality of an entire institution or a specific program of study. It's either a programmatic accreditation or it's institutional. Programmatic accreditation is an assessment of a particular program of study, such as law, music, or library science. Institutional accreditation means the entire institution has been assessed, from the governance and financial stability of the programs of study, and student services of that institution. The Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools, or ACICS, is, like the regional accrediting agencies, a national accrediting...an institutional accrediting agency. That means they look at the entire institution. Now, are they a legitimate accrediting agency? Is something going to happen here if this should be opened up to allow postsecondary institutions accredited by national accrediting association, guaranteed by the Department of Education, United States Department of Education, if they're allowed in also? The ACICS is a nonprofit education corporation founded in 1912 and has been recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education since 1956, which was just four years after the recognition process was introduced. It is recognized as a national accrediting body of postsecondary institutions offering primary business and business-related programs of study at nondegree, associate, bachelor, master degree levels. Now, there is an organization that has the function of recognizing institutional accrediting agencies and that is called the Council of Higher Education Accreditation, and it was formed by the presidents of colleges and universities across the United States. ACICS is the only national accrediting agency recognized by CHEA, as are the six regional accrediting bodies. What we're dealing with then is an issue of, are they able to participate in a program that's going to be open to all of the other institutions of postsecondary across
