SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, very briefly, I'm going to oppose this amendment and it's not so much I'm opposed to the amendment, but I do think that we ought to have a little better understanding of it. I'd like to ask Senator Peterson one question though.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Peterson, Senator Wehrbein has a question. Would you respond?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Yes, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...if I recall, is this...has this been allowed...I'll call it temporarily? Was there a grandfather clause on these two and now we have to extend this and that's what some of this is about?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: It...it follows along the same issue, Senator Wehrbein, but the grandfather clause was allowed for these three colleges to be able to get the PEAP, which is the Postsecondary Educational Award scholarship funds, the state scholarship funds. The two that had been nonprofit before July 1st, I believe, of 1991 would be grandfathered in. Any educational institution which was nonprofits...nonprofit since January 1, 1998, would have to be accredited by the accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education. So, the issue was over the postsecondary education funds; not this. This is the same thing, though, as long as it's regional as opposed to national or any accrediting agency recognized by the Department of Education. Those three would be kept out. They're not grandfathered into this one.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. So what we do here has no...what has been done has no bearing on this one in terms of a sunset, so-called. I was thinking we temporarily put them in, if I'm on the right track, but that...this...apparently this isn't this issue, where we let them...we were going to look at it again.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: You...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That isn't this.
