those. Okay. Now, for an appointed board, their allocation comes as a division of the county within either the 30 or the 45 cents, depending on what the county has done with it. And if the county, as a whole, has to...or places the question of an override before the voters, then that's done on a ballot.

SENATOR BEUTLER: For the whole county levy.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: For the whole county.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much. That's all.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Chair recognizes Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Wickersham, in looking at the fiscal note, I noted that it talks about any additional tax levy approved by an elected county fair board could not exceed 3.5 cents of 100 percent valuation. Now you're saying that they could exceed that 3.5 cents if they...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No. No, you can't exceed the 3.5 cents even if you're in a levy override. There's still a cap beyond the cap.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, that's what I...that's...I wanted to make that...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...clear. Now, secondly, the...the vote that you were talking about of the...those people that show up and vote, the majority votes for it, can go up to that 3.5 cents. Is that right?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: And if you had a called meeting, let me get this straight, the county fair board can call the meeting. Is that correct?
