

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, lay it out so that I can try to grasp.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, an elected county fair board...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...would look more like a noncode agency. A county...an appointed county fair board looks like a code agency.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd know the difference between code and noncode but, again, when we bring it to the county and these items, I'm kind of confused. But if this bill passes, then the elected boards can do more...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...with this bill than they could do now.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Elected county fair boards don't exist.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that's...you're just creating something now out of whole cloth with this, and that's the elected county fair board.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the only thing that exists now is the appointed fair board.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: And a county agricultural society, which is typically a nonprofit corporation.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that would not be touched by this bill, though, would it?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll try to digest this. Thank you, Senator Wickersham.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Seeing no
