SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so you wouldn't just have to wait for a county board...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...which may be opposed to it.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The citizens could petition to do this.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, when you get the elected board in place, it could do exactly what currently an appointed board could do.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it do any more?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so it's just a different structure put together in a different manner to do what is currently done by an appointed board.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if there is no appointed board, say in Douglas County they decide to do away with it altogether, an appointed board, then the only way you could get something together is if the citizens petitioned...
